WEEKEND OF AUGUST 2ND LOST WORLD (B&W) 1925



With a new "Jurrasic World Rebirth" movie out this summer ... the beatniks went back into the vault to find "The Lost World" - a 1925 American silent fantasy giant monster adventure film, adapted from Arthur Conan Doyle's 1912 novel of the same name. Produced and distributed by First National Pictures, a major Hollywood studio at the time, the film stars Wallace Beery as Professor Challenger and features pioneering stop motion special effects by Willis O'Brien, a forerunner of his work on "King Kong" (from 1933). In 1998, The Lost World was deemed "culturally, historically or aesthetically significant" by the Library of Congress and selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry. The music for this silent classic is provided by none other than our own David Kane and Them Jazzbeards.

WEEKEND OF AUGUST 9TH

THE BIRD WITH THE CRYSTAL PLUMAGE (COLOR) 1970

Bird,Theo, and Spectra say pass the pasta for this Italian gem. Tony Musante stars as an American writer in Rome who witnesses a serial killer targeting young women, and tries to uncover the murderer's identity before he becomes their next victim. An international, commercial, and critical success, "The Bird with the Crystal Plumage" has been credited with popularizing the Italian genre of horror-thriller.

WEEKEND OF AUGUST 16TH CARNIVAL OF SOULS (B&W) 1962



Bird, Spectra, and Theo visit our Erie County Fair to enjoy the carnival...while presenting one of the most terrifying films from our library. The 1962 independent horror film was produced and directed by Herk Harvey, starring Candace Hilligoss. The plot follows a young woman whose life is disturbed after a car accident. She relocates to a new city, where she finds herself unable to associate with the locals, and becomes drawn to the pavilion of an abandoned carnival. Director

Harvey also appears in the film as a ghoulish stranger who stalks her throughout.

WEEKEND OF AUGUST 23RD NIGHTMARE ALLEY (B&W) 1947

The summer carnival season continues as Zelda presents a film noir classic. Tyrone Power stars as a carnival barker and con man. Watch his rise and fall as he clings to Mademoiselle Zeena, (played by Joan Blondell), and a crafty businesswoman, as a mentalist whose lies and deceit prove to be his downfall.

INVASION OF THE STAR CREATURES (B&W) 1962

This flick was written by Jonathan Haze, the actor best known for his starring role in the Roger Corman feature, "The Little Shop of Horrors."
